



## Anne Slade Frey Scholarship June 24 – July 21, 2007 Querétaro, Mexico

The Anne Slade Frey Scholarship is offered by Interamerican University Studies Institute in memory of an exceptional woman who made significant contributions to the cause of peace and social justice, and whose love of Mexican art and crafts was contagious to those who knew her.

Anne Slade Frey - 1900-1992

Anne was active in the political and cultural life of the Upper Connecticut Valley, mentoring generations as a music and art teacher and setting a moral and social example for students and community members. Anne loved the arts of Mexico. In the early Thirties she befriended Mexican painter José Clemente Orozco, creator of the impressive murals in Baker Library at Dartmouth College, and his family, a friendship that lasted for the rest of her lifetime.

For IUSI, Anne Slade Frey exemplifies the bridging of cultures through art.

Purpose: To enable a deserving high school student to participate in **Artes en México** in the summer of 2007. See website for complete program description.

The scholarship covers all tuition and fees as well as room and board with a Mexican family during the four weeks of the program. Not included: round trip airfare to Mexico City and personal expenses, estimated to be \$85 per week.

Eligibility: The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of financial need to a student residing in Vermont or New Hampshire whose love of the arts shows promise of enrichment by this experience in Mexico. Additional requirements for eligibility to participate in the program are listed on the program flyer.

To apply: Complete the application for **Artes en México** and submit to IUSI. Candidates should also submit the scholarship form at the same time. Applications must be received by IUSI not later than February 9, 2007. No deposit is required for ASF scholarship applicants. Because we will be interviewing your references by phone or e mail, it may take several weeks to reach an award decision. All applicants will be notified immediately thereafter.
